6.A (**For Possible Action**) To authorize the Transportation Manager to negotiate and execute an Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Tahoe Transportation District and Douglas County substantially in the form of the agreement presented to the RTC.

Staff Summary: The Agreement was originally executed in October 2011 and provided for Tahoe Transportation District's (TTD) operation of the Lake & Valley Express routes that connect the Carson Valley to the Lake Tahoe Basin. The Agreement is updated to reflect changes to the service and other administrative changes. However, the service is in danger of losing funding and may cease to operate beginning in October.

6.B (**Information only**) Update on the operations of the Jump Around Carson (JAC) transit system and on the direction of the system going forward.

Staff Summary: Staff will provide an update on the JAC transit system's recent performance alongside an outlook on the future, including ridership, funding, and routing changes.

6.C (**For Possible Action**) To determine that Sierra Nevada Construction, Inc. is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder pursuant to NRS Chapter 338 and to award Contract No. 1819-003 Silver Sage Drive Roadway Reconstruction Project for a base bid of \$614,007.00 plus a 10% contingency amount up to \$61,400.70 for a total not to exceed amount of \$675,407.70 to be funded from the Transportation Infrastructure Account as provided in the FY18 budget.

Staff Summary: The project proposes to reconstruct approximately 1,920 linear feet of Silver Sage Drive from Clearview Avenue to Roland Avenue, including drainage pipe, concrete valley gutters, traffic control, and all other incidentals needed to complete the project.

6.D (For Possible Action) To authorize the Transportation Manager to sign Cooperative Agreement #P224-18-816 between Carson City and the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), for the purpose of installation, long term operation and maintenance, and the City's commitment to a 5% local match or a maximum of \$30,000, for two rectangular rapid flashing located on Stewart Street.

Staff Summary: The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) has implemented a Highway Safety Improvement Program to fund projects that advance safety goals in Nevada. This location was identified through the program's Pedestrian Uncontrolled Crosswalk Guidelines, which take into account pedestrian land use generators, such as retail and office uses.

Background/Issues & Analysis

The Agreement facilitates the provision of regularly scheduled, fixed route commuter express service between South Lake Tahoe, Carson City and Minden/Gardnerville. The service is open to the public for all trip purposes, is fully accessible to persons with disabilities, and was established as a "triangle" service with one route travelling between South Lake Tahoe and Minden/Gardnerville (Route 20x), one between Minden/Gardnerville and Carson City (Route 19x), and one between Carson City and South Lake Tahoe (Route 21x). In 2016, as a result of TTD's federal reclassification from a rural to an urban area, one of the original Lake & Valley routes (Route 21x) was discontinued. Further funding shortages threaten continuation of the two remaining routes.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TAHOE TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT, DOUGLAS COUNTY AND THE CARSON CITY REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Regarding Implementation of Regular, Fixed Route, Commuter Express Public Transit Services between Carson City, Nevada; the communities of Minden *I* Gardnerville, Nevada; and South Lake Tahoe, California

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered this _____ day of May 2018, by and between the Tahoe Transportation District, a special purpose district created by Article IX of the Tahoe Regional Planning Compact, hereinafter referred to as "TTD", the Carson City Regional Transportation Commission, hereinafter referred to as "RTC", and Douglas County, for the purpose of defining agency roles, responsibilities, and commitments in conjunction with the provision of regular, fixed-route commuter express public transit service between South Lake Tahoe, CA, Carson City, NV and Minden *I* Gardnerville, NV on the State Route 207 and Highway 395 corridors between the aforementioned communities (hereinafter referred to as "the Service").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 277.180(1) allows any one or more public agencies to contract with any one or more other public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform; and

WHEREAS, NRS 277.180(3)(g) provides that the authorized purposes of an agreement made pursuant to NRS 277.180(1) includes the joint use or operation of a system of public transportation;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. Purpose of Agreement

The purpose of this Agreement is a cooperative operational arrangement that will facilitate the provision of regularly scheduled, fixed-route, commuter express intercity bus service between South Lake Tahoe and Minden / Gardnerville, Nevada; and between Carson City, Nevada and Minden / Gardnerville, Nevada. The service will be open to the public for all trip purposes and will be fully accessible to persons with disabilities.

2. Lead Agency

TTD is the lead agency for administration of the Project and will be responsible for service contracting and compliance with all federal and state requirements, including reporting requirements pursuant to the National Transit Database. TTD shall indemnify, defend and hold Douglas County and the RTC, the officers and employees thereof, harmless from all costs,

expenses, losses, liabilities, and judgments arising out of or caused by the acts or omission of TTD, its officers, agents, or employees solely in the performance of this Agreement. Douglas County and the RTC shall indemnify, defend and hold the TTD, its officers and employees, harmless from all costs, expenses, losses, liabilities, and judgments arising out of or caused by the acts or omission of Douglas County and the RTC, its officers, agents or employees, solely in the performance of this Agreement.

3. Service Contracting

TTD will be responsible for the operation and scheduling of the commuter services, provide for the legal operating authority and ensure that all requisite insurance provisions are met.

4. Service Plan

The bus service, routes 19x and 20x, will continue to operate seven (7) days per week between the Stateline Transit Center in South Lake Tahoe, California and the JAC Transfer Point in downtown Carson City, Nevada using the aforementioned corridors. The service will continue to make connections to RTC INTERCITY, Douglas Area Rural Transit, ESTA, and JAC. Service will generally operate between 5:30 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. TTD reserves the right to make service revisions.

5. Funding

TTD shall be responsible for the funding of the commuter services described in the Service Plan. Nothing in this agreement is understood to preclude the RTC or Douglas County from future participation in the funding of the Service.

Funding Sources

The primary sources of funding for the Project will include FTA Section 5311 funds through NDOT and other local funds that TTD can allocate to the Service.

6. Bus Equipment

The Service will utilize ADA accessible vehicles suitable for highway operations. TTD will provide all buses.

7. Bus Stops

Bus stops in Carson City will be installed, maintained and paid for by the RTC. Bus stops in Minden *I* Gardnerville will be installed, maintained and paid for with Federal funds available to Douglas County. All other bus stops will be installed, maintained and paid for by TTD.

8. Fares

TTD's fare structure on routes 19x and 20x is as follows:

One Way: \$4.00 Day Pass: \$10.00 Monthly Pass: \$120.00 20 Ride Pass: \$60.00

Reduced Fare One Way: \$2.00 *Passengers must prove reduced

fare eligibility.

RTC and Douglas County shall accept TTD transfers as fare credit on JAC and DART routes. TTD shall accept JAC and DART transfers as fare on TTD Express routes.

9. Marketing

Marketing activities, including, without limitation, the preparation of promotional materials and printed schedules, will be developed by TTD. The parties will work cooperatively to come up with a marketing strategy that maximizes ridership and effectiveness of the service.

10. Maintenance

TTD shall coordinate and provide all major repairs and preventive maintenance functions on its vehicles.

11. Effective Date

This Agreement becomes effective immediately upon its adoption and approval by each of the governing bodies of the participating entities ("Effective Date").

This Agreement shall be automatically renewed for a one-year period on each anniversary date of the Effective Date thereafter, unless one of the parties to the Agreement serves, by certified mail, on one or both of the other parties a written notice of termination thirty (30) days prior to the date of expiration, in which event this Agreement shall terminate on the date of expiration.

12. Amendment

This Agreement may only be amended by the written consent of all parties.

13. Termination

This Agreement may, by mutual consent, be terminated upon thirty (30) days' written notice.

The continuation of this Agreement is subject to and contingent upon sufficient funds being appropriated, budgeted, and otherwise made available to the RTC, Douglas County and/or TTD by the State Legislature, the FTA and/or any other source for the operation of the Service. The RTC, Douglas County or TTD may terminate this Agreement, and the RTC, Douglas County and/or TTD

waive any and all claims for damages, effective immediately upon service of written notice, or any date specified therein, if for any reason one party's funding from state, federal and/or other sources for the operation of the Service is not appropriated or is withdrawn, limited or impaired.

14. Miscellaneous Provisions

- A) In the event of any dispute arising under this Agreement as to performance, compensation, and the interpretation of satisfactory fulfillment of the terms of this Agreement, the forum for resolution of any such dispute shall be by binding arbitration in accordance with the Nevada Uniform Arbitration Act of 2000, NRS 38.206, et seq., including rights to discovery. In such case, the arbitrator shall have both legal and equitable jurisdiction, and the arbitration award shall be final, and judgment on the arbitration award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction over the subject matter of the controversy.
- B) This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereto shall be governed by, and construed according to, the laws of the State of Nevada. The parties consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Nevada district courts for enforcement of this Agreement.
- C) All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally in hand, by telephone facsimile with simultaneous regular mail, or mailed certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid on the date posted and addressed to the other parties at the addresses set forth below:

- D) The parties are associated with each other only for the purposes and to the extent set forth in this Agreement. Each party is and shall be an entity separate and distinct from the other party and shall have the right to supervise, manage, operate, control and direct performance of the details incident to its duties under this Agreement.
- E) No party shall be deemed to be in violation of this Agreement if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder for any reason beyond its control, including, without limitation, strikes, inmate disturbances, acts of God, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods, winds storms, failure of public transportation, or any other similar serious cause beyond the reasonable control of either party. In such an event the intervening cause must not be through the fault of the party asserting such an excuse, and the excused party is obligated to promptly perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement after the intervening cause ceases.
- F) Each party shall keep confidential all information, in whatever form, produced, prepared, observed or received by that party to the extent that such information is confidential by law or otherwise required by this Agreement.
- G) Pursuant to NRS 239.010, information or documents may be open to public inspection and copying. The parties will have the duty to disclose unless a particular record is confidential by law or a common law balancing of interests.
- H) The illegality or invalidity of any provision or portion of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement and this Agreement shall be construed as if such provision did not exist and the non-enforceability of such provision shall not be held to render any other provision or provisions of this Agreement unenforceable.
- I) The parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of each party has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that the parties are authorized by law to engage in the activities which form the subject of this Agreement.
- J) This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body of each party.
- K) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and such is

Background/Issues & Analysis

Significant changes were implemented for the JAC fixed route system in April 2017. Since then, ridership for each month has exceeded the prior year's ridership recorded for that corresponding month. The 2017 route changes were most significant along Routes 2A/2B, which each broke all-time monthly ridership records.

Based on recent customer surveys and continued growth in ridership and the City as a whole, more changes to the JAC transit system are being considered. One change being considered is to Route 3, which serves south Carson City, with a route extension from Costco to Topsy Lane. This extension would better serve JAC customers by providing a direct connection to Douglas County's regional shopping area and would improve access for Douglas residents to Carson City services. Implementation of the South Carson Street Complete Streets project may inform additional reconfiguration of the route.

While a competitive grant was awarded for the purchase of two replacement fixed route buses, and a sizable increase to CAMPO's annual apportionments was announced for FY 2018, the funding outlook for JAC's capital and operating needs is limited by stagnant local funds.









 - 2.1.1 **CONTRACTOR** agrees that the Contract Documents for Bid No.1819-003 including, but not limited to, the Notice to Contractors, Table of Contents, Project Coordination, Instructions to Bidders, Contract Award Information, General Conditions, Special Conditions, Technical Specification, Prevailing Wages, Contract Drawings, and Addenda, if any, are intended to be complete and complementary and are intended to describe a complete WORK. These documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Contract. 3. <u>CONTRACT TERM AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES</u>:

- 3.1 **CONTRACTOR** agrees to complete the WORK on or before the date specified in the Notice to Proceed or any executed Change Orders to the entire satisfaction of **CITY** before final payment is made, unless sooner termination by either party as specified in **Section 6** (CONTRACT TERMINATION) and the General Conditions, Section GC 3.18.
- 3.2 Pursuant to the provisions under Time for Completion and Liquidated Damages in the Contract Documents of said Specifications, **CONTRACTOR** will complete the WORK within the Contract time. Since **CITY** and **CONTRACTOR** agree it is difficult to ascertain the actual amount of damages incurred due to delay of the Project, it is agreed that **CITY** will be paid the liquidated damages as specified in the Contract Special Conditions for each and every calendar day of delay in the completion of the WORK, in addition to any direct charges incurred by **CITY** as a result of delay of the Project, including engineering fees and additional damages due to late construction. **CITY** also reserves the right to deduct any amounts due **CITY** from any monies earned by **CONTRACTOR** under this Contract.
- 3.3 That in the performance of this Contract, **CONTRACTOR** and any subcontractors, as employers, shall pay 1 ½ times an employee's regular wage rate whenever an employee who received compensation for employment at a rate less than 1 ½ time the minimum wage who works more than forty (40) hours in any scheduled work week, more than eight (8) hours in a day, unless by mutual agreement the employee works a scheduled ten (10) hours per day for four (4) calendar days within a work week. 5. <u>COMPENSATION:</u>

5.1 The parties agree that **CONTRACTOR** will provide the WORK specified in the Contract for the Contract Amount of (Six Hundred Fourteen Thousand Seven Dollars and 00/100 (\$614,007.00).

- 5.2 **CITY** will pay **CONTRACTOR** progress payments and the final payment computed from the actual quantities of WORK performed and accepted and the materials furnished at the Unit and Lump Sum prices shown on **CONTRACTOR'S** Bid Proposal and any executed Change Orders.
- 5.3 Contract Amount represents full and adequate compensation for the complete WORK, and includes the furnishing of all materials, all labor, equipment, tools, transportation, services, appliances, and all expenses, direct or indirect connected with the proper execution of the WORK.
- 5.4 CITY does not agree to reimburse CONTRACTOR for expenses unless otherwise specified.

6. <u>CONTRACT TERMINATION</u>:

- 6.1 Termination Without Cause:
 - 6.1.1 Any discretionary or vested right of renewal notwithstanding, this Contract may be terminated upon written notice by mutual consent of both parties or unilaterally by either party without cause.
 - 6.1.2 **CITY** reserves the right to terminate this Contract for convenience whenever it considers termination, in its sole and unfettered discretion, to be in the public interest. In the event that the Contract is terminated in this manner, payment will be made for WORK actually completed. - 6.3.2.4 If **CITY** materially breaches any material duty under this Contract and any such breach impairs **CONTRACTOR'S** ability to perform; or
- 6.3.2.5 If it is found by **CITY** that any quid pro quo or gratuities in the form of money, services, entertainment, gifts, or otherwise were offered or given by **CONTRACTOR**, or any agent or representative of **CONTRACTOR**, to any officer or employee of **CITY** with a view toward securing a contract or securing favorable treatment with respect to awarding, extending, amending, or making any determination with respect to the performing of such contract; or
- 6.3.2.6 If it is found by **CITY** that **CONTRACTOR** has failed to disclose any material conflict of interest relative to the performance of this Contract.
- 6.3.2.7 **CITY** may terminate this Contract if **CONTRACTOR**:
 - 6.3.2.7.1 Fails to maintain bonding, Nevada State Contractors' Board License, State Industrial Insurance requirements or insurance policies for limits as defined in this Contract; or
 - 6.3.2.7.2 Persistently or materially refuses or fails to supply properly skilled workers or proper materials; or
 - 6.3.2.7.3 Fails to make payment to subcontractors for materials or labor in accordance with the respective agreements between **CONTRACTOR** and the subcontractors; or
 - 6.3.2.7.4 Disregards laws, ordinances, or rules, regulations or order of a public authority having jurisdiction; or
 - 6.3.2.7.5 Otherwise makes a material breach of a provision of this Contract; or
 - 6.3.2.7.6 **CONTRACTOR** fails to maintain safe working conditions.
- 6.3.3 When any of the <u>Subsection 6.3.2.7.1 through 6.3.2.7.6, inclusive</u>, cause reasons exist, and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies of CITY, CITY may terminate this Contract at any time after giving CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S Surety <u>seven (7) calendar days</u> written notice of default or breach and intent to terminate and CONTRACTOR'S subsequent failure to timely correct as provided below, and subject to any prior rights of the Surety, CITY may:
 - 6.3.3.1 Take possession of the site and of all materials, equipment, tools and construction equipment and machinery thereon owned by **CONTRACTOR**;

- 6.3.4.2 If the unpaid balance of the Contract Amount exceeds the cost of finishing the WORK including expenses made necessary thereby, such excess shall be paid to **CONTRACTOR**. If the costs of finishing the WORK exceed the unpaid balance, **CONTRACTOR** shall pay the difference to **CITY**. The amount to be paid to **CONTRACTOR** or **CITY**, as the case may be, shall survive termination of this Contract.
- 6.3.4.3 In the event of such cause termination, all monies due **CONTRACTOR** or retained under the terms of this Contract shall be held by **CITY**, however, such holdings will not release **CONTRACTOR** or its Sureties from liability for failure to fulfill this Contract. Any excess cost over and above the Contract Amount incurred by **CITY** arising from the termination of the operations of this Contract and the completion of the WORK by **CITY** as provided above shall be paid for by any available funds held by **CITY**. **CONTRACTOR** will be so credited with any surplus remaining after all just claims for such completion have been paid.
- 6.4 If at any time before completion of the WORK under this Contract, the WORK shall be stopped by an injunction of a court of competent jurisdiction or by order of any competent government authority, CITY may give immediate notice to CONTRACTOR to discontinue the WORK and terminate this Contract. CONTRACTOR shall discontinue the WORK in such manner, sequence, and at such times as CITY may direct. CONTRACTOR shall have no claim for damages for such discontinuance or termination, nor any claim for anticipated profits on the WORK thus dispensed with, nor for any claim for penalty, nor for any other claim such as unabsorbed overhead, except for the WORK actually performed up to the time of discontinuance, including any extra WORK ordered by CITY to be done.

6.5 Time to Correct (Declared Default or Breach):

6.5.1 Termination upon a declared default or breach may be exercised only after providing 7 (seven) calendar days written notice of default or breach, and the subsequent failure of the defaulting or breaching party, within five (5) calendar days of providing that default or breach notice, to provide evidence satisfactory to the aggrieved party demonstrating that the declared default or breach has been corrected. Time to correct shall run concurrently with any notice of default or breach and such time to correct is not subject to any stay with respect to the nonexistence of any Notice of Termination. Untimely correction shall not void the right to termination otherwise properly noticed unless waiver of the noticed default or breach is expressly provided in writing by the aggrieved party. There shall be no time to correct with respect to any notice of termination without cause, termination for nonappropriation or termination due to court injunction or order of a competent government authority.

6.6 Winding Up Affairs Upon Termination:

- 6.6.1 In the event of termination of this Contract for any reason, the parties agree that the provisions of this **Subsection 6.6** survive termination:
 - 6.6.1.1 The parties shall account for and properly present to each other all claims for fees and expenses and pay those which are undisputed and otherwise not subject to set off under this Contract. Neither party may withhold performance of winding up provisions solely based on nonpayment of fees or expenses accrued up to the time of termination; and
 - 6.6.1.2 **CONTRACTOR** shall satisfactorily complete WORK in progress at the agreed rate (or a pro rata basis if necessary) if so requested by **CITY**; and
 - 6.6.1.3 **CONTRACTOR** shall execute any documents and take any actions necessary to effectuate an assignment of this Contract if so requested by **CITY**; and

6.6.1.4 **CONTRACTOR** shall preserve, protect, and promptly deliver into **CITY** possession all proprietary information in accordance with **Section 21**.

6.7 Notice of Termination:

6.7.1 Unless otherwise specified in this Contract, termination shall not be effective until seven (7) calendar days after a party has provided written notice of default or breach, or notice of without cause termination. Notice of Termination may be given at the time of notice of default or breach, or notice of without cause termination. Notice of Termination may be provided separately at any time after the running of the 7-day notice period, and such termination shall be effective on the date the Notice of Termination is provided to the party unless a specific effective date is otherwise set forth therein. Any delay in providing a Notice of Termination after the 7-day notice period has run without a timely correction by the defaulting or breaching party shall not constitute any waiver of the right to terminate under the existing notice(s).

7. DAVIS-BACON & RELATED ACTS 29 CFR PARTS 1,3,5,6,&7 AND NRS 338.070(5):

- contractor or subcontractor must provide a <u>weekly</u> statement of wages paid to each of its employees engaged in covered WORK. The statement shall be executed by **CONTRACTOR** or subcontractor or by an authorized officer or employee of **CONTRACTOR** or subcontractor who supervised the payment of wages and shall be on the "Statement of Compliance" form. **CONTRACTOR** shall submit a Statement of Compliance that is prescribed by the Nevada Labor Commissioner or contains <u>identical</u> wording. Per NRS 338.070(6) the records maintained pursuant to subsection 5 must be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of the public body (the **CITY'S** representative) awarding the contract. The **CONTRACTOR** engaged on the public work or subcontractor engaged on the public work shall ensure that a copy of each record for each calendar month is received by the public body awarding the contract (the **City**) **no later than 15 days after the end of the month**.
- 7.2 In the event federal funds are used for payment of all or part of this Contract, **CONTRACTOR** shall submit a Statement of Compliance form WH347 or a form with <u>identical</u> wording <u>and</u> a Statement of Compliance prescribed by the Nevada Labor Commissioner **within 7 days after the regular pay date for the pay period**. The original Statements shall be delivered to Carson City Public Works, 3505 Butti Way, Carson City, Nevada 89703, attention Davis-Bacon/Federal Funding Compliance.

7.3 CERTIFIED PAYROLLS FOR DAVIS-BACON AND PREVAILING WAGE PROJECTS:

- 7.3.1 The higher of the Federal or local prevailing wage rates for CITY, as established by the Nevada Labor Commission and the Davis-Bacon Act, shall be paid for all classifications of labor on this project WORK. Should a classification be missing from the Davis-Bacon rates the CONTRACTOR shall complete a request of authorization for additional classification or rate form SF1444 in its entirety and submit it to the CITY for approval and submission to the U.S. Department of Labor. Also, in accordance with NRS 338, the hourly and daily wage rates for the State and Davis-Bacon must be posted at the work site by CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that a copy of CONTRACTOR'S and subcontractor's certified payrolls for each calendar week are received by CITY.
- 7.3.2 Per NRS 338.070(5) a **CONTRACTOR** engaged on a public work and each subcontractor engaged on the public work shall keep or cause to be kept:
 - (a) An accurate record showing, for each worker employed by the contractor or subcontractor in connection with the public work:
 - The name of the worker;

- (2) The occupation of the worker;
- (3) The gender of the worker, if the worker voluntarily agreed to specify that information pursuant to subsection 4, or an entry indicating that the worker declined to specify such information;
- (4) The ethnicity of the worker, if the worker voluntarily agreed to specify that information pursuant to subsection 4, or an entry indicating that the worker declined to specify such information;
- (5) If the worker has a driver's license or identification card, an indication of the state or other jurisdiction that issued the license or card; and
- (6) The actual per diem, wages and benefits paid to the worker; and
- (b) An <u>additional accurate record</u> showing, for each worker employed by the contractor or subcontractor in connection with the public work who has a driver's license or identification card:
 - (1) The name of the worker:
 - (2) The driver's license number or identification card number of the worker; and
 - (3) The state or other jurisdiction that issued the license or card.
- 7.3.3 The original payroll records shall be certified and shall be submitted <u>weekly</u> to Carson City Public Works, 3505 Butti Way, Carson City, Nevada 89703, attention Davis-Bacon/Federal Funding Compliance. Submission of such certified payrolls shall be a condition precedent for processing the monthly progress payment. **CONTRACTOR**, as General Contractor, shall collect the wage reports from the subcontractors and ensure the receipt of a certified copy of each weekly payroll for submission to **CITY** as one complete package.
- 7.3.4 Pursuant to NRS 338.060 and 338.070, **CONTRACTOR** hereby agrees to forfeit, as a penalty to **CITY**, not less than Twenty Dollars (\$20) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each calendar day or portion thereof that each worker employed on the Contract is paid less than the designated rate for any WORK done under the Contract, by **CONTRACTOR** or any subcontractor under him/her, or is not reported to **CITY** as required by NRS 338.070.

8. FAIR EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES:

- Pursuant to NRS 338.125, Fair Employment Practices, the following provisions must be included in any contract between **CONTRACTOR** and a public body such as **CITY**:
 - 8.1.1 In connection with the performance of work under this Contract, CONTRACTOR agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or age, including, without limitation, with regard to employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including without limitation, apprenticeship.
 - 8.1.2 **CONTRACTOR** further agrees to insert this provision in all subcontracts hereunder, except subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- 8.2 If the CITY was required by NRS 332.039(1) to advertise or request a proposal for this Agreement, by signing this Agreement, the CONTRACTOR provides a written certification that the CONTRACTOR is not currently engaged in, and during the Term shall not engage in, a Boycott of Israel. The term "Boycott of Israel" has the meaning ascribed to that term in Section 3 of Nevada Senate Bill 26

(2017). The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for fines, penalties, and payment of any State of Nevada or federal funds that may arise (including those that the CITY pays, becomes liable to pay, or becomes liable to repay) as a direct result of the CONTRACTOR's non-compliance with this Section.

9. <u>PREFERENTIAL EMPLOYMENT</u>:

- 9.1 Unless, and except if, this Contract is funded in whole or in part by federal grant funding (see 40 C.F.R. § 31.36(c) *Competition*), pursuant to NRS 338.130, in all cases where persons are employed in the construction of public works, preference must be given, the qualifications of the applicants being equal: (1) First: To persons who have been honorably discharged from the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard of the United States, a reserve component thereof or the National Guard; and are citizens of the State of Nevada. (2) Second: To other citizens of the State of Nevada.
- 9.2 Unless, and except if, this Contract is funded in whole or in part by federal grant funding (see 40 CFR § 31.36(c) *Competition*), in connection with the performance of WORK under this Contract, **CONTRACTOR** agrees to comply with the provisions of NRS 338.130 requiring certain preferences to be given to which persons are employed in the construction of a public work. If **CONTRACTOR** fails to comply with the provisions of NRS 338.130, pursuant to the terms of NRS 338.130(3), this Contract is void, and any failure or refusal to comply with any of the provisions of this section renders this Contract void.

10. REMEDIES:

Except as otherwise provided for by law or this Contract, the rights and remedies of the parties shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or equity, including, without limitation, actual damages, and to a prevailing party reasonable attorney's fees and costs. The parties agree that, in the event a lawsuit is filed and a party is awarded attorney's fees by the court, for any reason, the amount of recoverable attorney's fees shall not exceed the rate of \$125 per hour. CITY may set off consideration against any unpaid obligation of CONTRACTOR to CITY.

11. LIMITED LIABILITY:

CITY will not waive and intends to assert available NRS Chapter 41 liability limitations in all cases. Contract liability of both parties shall not be subject to punitive damages. Liquidated damages shall not apply unless otherwise expressly provided for elsewhere in this Contract. Damages for any **CITY** breach shall never exceed the amount of funds appropriated for payment under this Contract, but not yet paid to **CONTRACTOR**, for the fiscal year budget in existence at the time of the breach. **CONTRACTOR'S** tort liability shall not be limited.

12. <u>FORCE MAJEURE</u>:

Neither party shall be deemed to be in violation of this Contract if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder due to strikes, failure of public transportation, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, or acts of God, including, without limitation, earthquakes, floods, winds, or storms. In such an event the intervening cause must not be through the fault of the party asserting such an excuse, and the excused party is obligated to promptly perform in accordance with the terms of this Contract after the intervening cause ceases.

13. INDEMNIFICATION:

- 13.1 To the extent permitted by law, including, but not limited to, the provisions of NRS Chapter 41, each party shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend, not excluding the other's right to participate, the other party from and against all liability, claims, actions, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to reasonable attorney's fees and costs, arising out of any alleged negligent or willful acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, employees and agents. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of the indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this Section.
- 13.2 Except as otherwise provided in <u>Subsection 13.4</u> below, the indemnifying party shall not be obligated to provide a legal defense to the indemnified party, nor reimburse the indemnified party for the same, for any period occurring before the indemnified party provides written notice of the pending

claim(s) or cause(s) of action to the indemnifying party, along with:

- 13.2.1 a written request for a legal defense for such pending claim(s) or cause(s) of action; and
- 13.2.2 a detailed explanation of the basis upon which the indemnified party believes that the claim or cause of action asserted against the indemnified party implicates the culpable conduct of the indemnifying party, its officers, employees, and/or agents.
- 13.3 After the indemnifying party has begun to provide a legal defense for the indemnified party, the indemnifying party shall not be obligated to fund or reimburse any fees or costs provided by any additional counsel for the indemnified party, including counsel through which the indemnified party might voluntarily choose to participate in its defense of the same matter.
- 13.4 After the indemnifying party has begun to provide a legal defense for the indemnified party, the indemnifying party shall be obligated to reimburse the reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred by the indemnified party during the initial thirty (30) day period of the claim or cause of action, if any, incurred by separate counsel.

14. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:

- 14.1 **CONTRACTOR**, as an independent contractor, is a natural person, firm or corporation who agrees to perform WORK for a fixed price according to his or its own methods and without subjection to the supervision or control of the **CITY**, except as to the results of the WORK, and not as to the means by which the WORK are accomplished.
- 14.2 It is mutually agreed that **CONTRACTOR** is associated with **CITY** only for the purposes and to the extent specified in this Contract, and in respect to performance of the contracted WORK pursuant to this Contract. **CONTRACTOR** is and shall be an independent contractor and, subject only to the terms of this Contract, shall have the sole right to supervise, manage, operate, control, and direct performance of the details incident to its duties under this Contract.
- 14.3 Nothing contained in this Contract shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or joint venture, to create relationships of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for **CITY** whatsoever with respect to the indebtedness, liabilities, and obligations of **CONTRACTOR** or any other party.
- 14.4 **CONTRACTOR**, in addition to <u>Section 13</u> (INDEMNIFICATION), shall indemnify and hold **CITY** harmless from, and defend **CITY** against, any and all losses, damages, claims, costs, penalties, liabilities, expenses arising out of or incurred in any way because of, but not limited to, **CONTRACTOR'S** obligations or legal duties regarding any taxes, fees, assessments, benefits, entitlements, notice of benefits, employee's eligibility to work, to any third party, subcontractor, employee, state, local or federal governmental entity.
- 14.5 Neither **CONTRACTOR** nor its employees, agents, or representatives shall be considered employees, agents, or representatives of **CITY**.

15. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS (GENERAL):

- 15.1 NOTICE: The following general insurance requirements shall apply unless these general requirements are altered by the specific requirements set forth in CITY'S solicitation for bid document, the adopted bid or other document incorporated into this Contract by the parties. These general insurance requirements do not include terms related to bond(s) required for this Contract, which are set forth in the CITY'S solicitation and below in this Contract following the execution pages.
- 15.2 **CONTRACTOR**, as an independent contractor and not an employee of **CITY**, must carry policies of insurance in amounts specified and pay all taxes and fees incident hereunto. **CITY** shall have no liability except as specifically provided in this Contract.
- 15.3 **CONTRACTOR** shall not commence work before: (1) **CONTRACTOR** has provided the required evidence of insurance to **CITY** Purchasing and Contracts, and (2) **CITY** has approved the insurance policies provided by **CONTRACTOR**.

- 15.4 Prior approval of the insurance policies by **CITY** shall be a condition precedent to any payment of consideration under this Contract and **CITY'S** approval of any changes to insurance coverage during the course of performance shall constitute an ongoing condition subsequent this Contract. Any failure of **CITY** to timely approve shall not constitute a waiver of the condition.
- 15.5 Insurance Coverage (15.6 through 15.23):
- 15.6 **CONTRACTOR** shall, at **CONTRACTOR**'S sole expense, procure, maintain and keep in force for the duration of this Contract the following insurance conforming to the minimum requirements specified below. Unless specifically specified herein or otherwise agreed to by **CITY**, the required insurance shall be in effect prior to the commencement of work by **CONTRACTOR** and shall continue in force as appropriate until the later of:
 - 15.6.1 Final acceptance by CITY of the completion of this Contract; or
 - 15.6.2 Such time as the insurance is no longer required by **CITY** under the terms of this Contract.
 - 15.6.3 Any insurance or self-insurance available to CITY under its coverage(s) shall be in excess of and non-contributing with any insurance required from CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR'S insurance policies shall apply on a primary basis. Until such time as the insurance is no longer required by CITY, CONTRACTOR shall provide CITY with renewal or replacement evidence of insurance no less than thirty (30) calendar days before the expiration or replacement of the required insurance. If at any time during the period when insurance is required by this Contract, an insurer or surety shall fail to comply with the requirements of this Contract, as soon as CONTRACTOR has knowledge of any such failure, CONTRACTOR shall immediately notify CITY and immediately replace such insurance or bond with an insurer meeting the requirements.
- 15.7 General Insurance Requirements (15.8 through 15.23:
- 15.8 **Certificate Holder:** Each certificate shall list Carson City c/o Carson City Purchasing and Contracts, 201 N. Carson Street, Suite 2, Carson City, NV 89701 as a certificate holder.
- 15.9 **Additional Insured:** By endorsement to the general liability insurance policy evidenced by **CONTRACTOR**, The City and County of Carson City, Nevada, its officers, employees and immune contractors shall be named as additional insureds for all liability arising from this Contract.
- 15.10 **Waiver of Subrogation**: Each liability insurance policy, except for professional liability, shall provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City.
- 15.11 **Cross-Liability**: All required liability policies shall provide cross-liability coverage as would be achieved under the standard ISO separation of insureds clause.
- 15.12 **Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions**: Insurance maintained by **CONTRACTOR** shall apply on a first dollar basis without application of a deductible or self-insured retention unless otherwise specifically agreed to by **CITY**. Such approval shall not relieve **CONTRACTOR** from the obligation to pay any deductible or self-insured retention. Any deductible or self-insured retention shall not exceed \$5,000.00 per occurrence, unless otherwise approved by **CITY**.
- 15.13 **Policy Cancellation**: Except for ten (10) calendar days notice for non-payment of premium, **CONTRACTOR** or its insurers must provide thirty (30) calendar days prior written notice to Carson City Purchasing and Contracts if any policy will be canceled, non-renewed or if required coverage and /or limits reduced or materially altered, and shall provide that notices required by this paragraph shall be sent by mail to Carson City Purchasing and Contracts, 201 N. Carson Street, Suite 2, Carson City, NV 89701. When available, each insurance policy shall be endorsed to provide thirty (30) days' notice of cancellation, except for ten (10) days' notice for non-payment of premium, to City.
- 15.14 **Approved Insurer**: Each insurance policy shall be issued by insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of Nevada or eligible surplus lines insurers under federal and Nevada law and having agents in Nevada upon whom service of process may be made, and currently rated by A.M. Best as "A-VII" or better.

- 15.15 **Evidence of Insurance:** Prior to commencement of work, **CONTRACTOR** must provide the following documents to Carson City Purchasing and Contracts, 201 North Carson Street, Suite 2, Carson City, NV 89701:
- 15.16 **Certificate of Insurance:** Contractor shall furnish City with a certificate(s) of insurance, executed by a duly authorized representative of each insurer, showing compliance with the insurance requirements set forth herein The Acord 25 Certificate of Insurance form or a form substantially similar must be submitted to Carson City Purchasing and Contracts to evidence the insurance policies and coverages required of **CONTRACTOR**.
- 15.17 **Additional Insured Endorsement:** An Additional Insured Endorsement (CG20 10 or C20 26), signed by an authorized insurance company representative, must be submitted to Carson City Purchasing and Contracts to evidence the endorsement of **CITY** as an additional insured per **Subsection 15.9** (Additional Insured).
- 15.18 **Schedule of Underlying Insurance Policies:** If Umbrella or Excess policy is evidenced to comply with minimum limits, a copy of the Underlying Schedule from the Umbrella or Excess insurance policy may be required.
- 15.19 **Review and Approval:** Documents specified above must be submitted for review and approval by **CITY** Purchasing and Contracts prior to the commencement of work by **CONTRACTOR**. Neither approval by **CITY** nor failure to disapprove the insurance furnished by **CONTRACTOR** shall relieve **CONTRACTOR** of **CONTRACTOR**'S full responsibility to provide the insurance required by this Contract. Compliance with the insurance requirements of this Contract shall not limit the liability of **CONTRACTOR** or its sub-contractors, employees or agents to **CITY** or others, and shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any other remedy available to **CITY** under this Contract or otherwise. **CITY** reserves the right to request and review a copy of any required insurance policy or endorsement to assure compliance with these requirements.

15.20 COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE:

Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability (CGL) and, if necessary, commercial umbrella insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence.

15.20.5	CGL insurance shall be written on ISO occurrence form CG 00 01 04 13 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, products-completed operations, personal and advertising injury, and liability assumed under an insured contract [(including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract)].
15.20.6	City and County of Carson City, Nevada, its officers, employees and immune contractors shall be included as an insured under the CGL, using ISO additional insured endorsement CG 20 10 or CG 20 26, or a substitute providing equivalent coverage, and under the commercial umbrella, if any.
15.20.7	This insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance programs afforded to City There shall be no endorsement or modification of the CGL to make it excess over other available insurance; alternatively, if the CGL states that it is excess or pro rata, the policy shall be endorsed to be primary with respect to the additional insured.
15.20.8	There shall be no endorsement or modification of the CGL limiting the scope of coverage for liability assumed under a contract.

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15.20.9 Contractor waives all rights against City and its agents, officers, directors and employees for recovery of damages to the extent these damages are covered by the commercial general liability or commercial umbrella liability insurance maintained pursuant to this Contract. Insurer shall endorse CGL policy as required to waive subrogation against City with respect to any loss paid under the policy

15.21 BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:

- 15.21.1 *Minimum Limit required*:
- 15.21.2 Contractor shall maintain automobile liability and, if necessary, commercial umbrella liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- 15.21.3 Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of owned, hired, and non-owned autos (as applicable). Coverage as required above shall be written on ISO form CA 00 01, CA 00 05, CA 00 25, or a substitute form providing equivalent liability coverage.
- 15.21.4 Contractor waives all rights against City and its agents, officers, directors and employees for recovery of damages to the extent these damages are covered by the automobile liability or other liability insurance obtained by Contractor pursuant this Contract.

15.22 PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE (Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors)

- 15.22.1 Minimum Limit required:
- 15.22.2 CONTRACTOR shall maintain professional liability insurance applying to all activities performed under this Contract with limits not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) in the aggregate.
- 15.22.3 Retroactive date: Prior to commencement of the performance of this Contract.
- 15.22.4 CONTRACTOR will maintain professional liability insurance during the term of this Contract and for a period of three (3) years after termination of this Contract unless waived by the City. In the event of non-renewal or other lapse in coverage during the term of this Contract or the three (3) year period described above, CONTRACTOR shall purchase Extended Reporting Period coverage for claims arising out of CONTRACTOR's negligence acts, errors and omissions committed during the term of the Professional Liability Policy. The Extended Reporting Period shall continue through a minimum of three (3) years after termination date of this Contract.
- 15.22.5 A certified copy of this policy may be required.

- 21.1 Any files, reports, histories, studies, tests, manuals, instructions, photographs, negatives, blue prints, plans, maps, data, system designs, computer programs, computer codes, and computer records (which are intended to be consideration under this Contract), or any other documents or drawings, prepared or in the course of preparation by **CONTRACTOR** (or its subcontractors) in performance of its obligations under this Contract shall be the exclusive property of **CITY** and all such materials shall be delivered into **CITY** possession by **CONTRACTOR** upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this Contract. **CONTRACTOR** shall not use, willingly allow, or cause to have such materials used for any purpose other than performance of **CONTRACTOR'S** obligations under this Contract without the prior written consent of **CITY**. Agenda Title: (**For Possible Action**) To authorize the Transportation Manager to sign Cooperative Agreement #P224-18-816 between Carson City and the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), for the purpose of installation, long term operation and maintenance, and the City's commitment to a 5% local match or a maximum of \$30,000, for two rectangular rapid flashing located on Stewart Street.

Staff Summary: The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) has implemented a Highway Safety Improvement Program to fund projects that advance safety goals in Nevada. This location was identified through the program's Pedestrian Uncontrolled Crosswalk Guidelines, which take into account pedestrian land use generators, such as retail and office uses.

Proposed Motion

Move to authorize the Transportation Manager to sign Cooperative Agreement #P224-18-816 between Carson City and the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), for the purpose of installation, long term operation and maintenance, and the City's commitment to a 5% local match or a maximum of \$30,000, for two rectangular rapid flashing located on Stewart Street.

Background/Issues & Analysis

The project is currently estimated to cost \$531,579. The project is being designed and delivered by NDOT. This project includes removing three uncontrolled crosswalks on Stewart Street between Little Lane and Wright Way. The current uncontrolled crosswalks assist pedestrians primarily accessing retail establishments near the Carson City Mall. Two controlled crosswalks will be installed, one at the Little Lane and Stewart Street intersection and the second as a mid-block crossing between the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Nevada Department of Transportation. The controlled crosswalks will employ rectangle rapid flashing beacons, median islands, and overhead lighting to improve safety.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into on , by and between the State of Nevada, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "DEPARTMENT," and CARSON CITY, a consolidated municipality and political subdivision of the State of Nevada, hereinafter called the "CITY," each of whom may be individually referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, a Cooperative Agreement is defined as an agreement between two or more public agencies for the "joint exercise of powers, privileges and authority;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions contained in Chapter 408 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), the Director of the DEPARTMENT may enter into agreements necessary to carry out the provisions of the Chapter; and

WHEREAS, NRS 277.110 authorizes any two or more public agencies to enter into agreements for joint or cooperative action; and

WHEREAS, the Parties to this Agreement are public agencies and authorized to enter into agreement in accordance with NRS 277.080 to 277.110; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is for the CITY to grant permission for the DEPARTMENT to enter the CITY'S right-of way to construct and to address each Party's responsibilities concerning the maintenance and operation of a rectangular rapid flashing beacon system located in Carson City, Nevada, on South Stewart Street, from 9th Street to South Carson Street, hereinafter called the "PROJECT;" and

WHEREAS, the total PROJECT costs are estimated to be Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$500,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the PROJECT is eligible for ninety-five percent (95%) federal funds and five percent (5%) CITY funds; and

WHEREAS, the rectangular rapid flashing beacon system will be of benefit to the DEPARTMENT and to the people of the State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto are willing and able to perform the services described herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants herein contained, it is agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I - CITY AGREES

1. To authorize the DEPARTMENT and its authorized agents and contractors to occupy the CITY's right-of-way and or easements for the purpose set forth in this Agreement, so long as the DEPARTMENT has obtained all permits required by the CITY and has complied with all CITY permit conditions.

- 2. To operate and maintain the rectangular rapid flashing beacon system described above in a manner that is reasonably satisfactory to the DEPARTMENT and, except as otherwise provided for in Article II, Paragraph 1, of this Agreement, without cost to the DEPARTMENT.
- 3. To be responsible for the payment of the five percent (5%) match of the total estimated costs of the PROJECT not to exceed Thirty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$30,000.00), which total PROJECT costs are estimated to be Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$500,000.00).
- 4. The CITY's match of five percent (5%) of the total PROJECT costs are estimated to be Twenty- Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$25,000.00).

ARTICLE II - DEPARTMENT AGREES

- 1. To pay all costs of equipment replacement necessary for major repairs of the rectangular rapid flashing beacons system including such major repairs as the result of accidental damage, provided repairs exceed One thousand Five Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$1,500.00) and is unrecoverable by insurance or other means. The DEPARTMENT agrees to pay one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of all equipment items replaced in accordance with this Paragraph 1.
- 2. To observe, review, and inspect all work associated with the PROJECT during construction with the understanding that any and all items of concern must be reported to the DEPARTMENT's Resident Engineer for correction.
 - 3. To perform construction administration of the PROJECT.

ARTICLE III - IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be from the date first written above through and including two years from date first written above. This Agreement shall be automatically renewed for an additional two-year period on the last day of each two-year term UNLESS a Party notifies the other Party in writing of its intention that this Agreement be terminated in accordance with Paragraph 4 of this Article III.
- 2. This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body of each Party and the Nevada Attorney General or his or her designee.
- 3. The CITY shall not proceed with the performance of any work under the terms of this Agreement until such time the CITY has received a copy of this fully executed Agreement, signed by all individuals on the signatory lines below. If the CITY does commence said work prior to receiving a copy of this fully executed Agreement, the CITY shall forfeit any and all right to reimbursement for that portion of the work performed prior to such receipt. Furthermore, the CITY shall not rely on the terms of this Agreement in any way, including, but not limited to, any written or oral representations and warranties made by the DEPARTMENT or any of its agents, employees, or affiliates, or on any dates of performance, deadlines, indemnities, or any other term contained in this Agreement or otherwise prior to such receipt. In the event the CITY violates the provisions of this Paragraph 3, the CITY waives any and all claims and damages against the DEPARTMENT, its employees, agents and/or affiliates, including but not limited to monetary damages and/or any other available remedy at law or in equity.

- 4. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party at any time, provided that a termination shall not be effective until thirty (30) calendar days after a Party has served written notice upon the other Party. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual consent of both Parties or unilaterally by either Party without cause. The Parties expressly agree that this Agreement shall be terminated immediately if for any reason Federal and/or State Legislature funding necessary to satisfy this Agreement is withdrawn, limited, or impaired.
- 5. All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally in hand, by telephonic facsimile or electronic mail with simultaneous regular mail, or mailed certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid on the date posted, and addressed to the other Party at the address set forth below:

- 6. Neither Party shall be deemed to be in violation of this Agreement if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder due to strikes, failure of public transportation, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, or acts of God, including without limitations, earthquakes, floods, winds or storms. In such an event the intervening cause must not be through the fault of the Party asserting such an excuse, and the excused Party is obligated to promptly perform in accordance with the terms of the Agreement after the intervening cause ceases.
- 7. To the fullest extent of NRS Chapter 41 liability limitations, each Party shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend, not excluding the other's right to participate, the other from and against all liability, claims, actions, damages, losses, and expenses, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, caused by the negligence, errors, omissions, recklessness, or intentional misconduct of its own officers, employees, and agents. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any Party or person described herein. This indemnification obligation is conditioned upon the performance of the duty of the Party seeking indemnification (indemnified Party), to serve the other Party (indemnifying Party) with written notice of actual or pending claim, within thirty (30) calendar days of the indemnified Party's notice of actual or pending claim or cause of action. The indemnifying Party shall not be liable for reimbursement of any attorney's fees and costs incurred by the indemnified Party due to said Party exercising its right to participate with legal counsel.

- 8. The Parties do not waive and intend to assert available NRS Chapter 41 liability limitations in all cases. Liability of both Parties shall not be subject to punitive damages. Actual damages for any DEPARTMENT breach shall never exceed the amount of funds which have been appropriated for payment under this Agreement, but not yet paid, for the fiscal year budget in existence at the time of the breach. Actual damages for any CITY breach shall never exceed the amount of funds which have been appropriated for payment or the performance of any work under this Agreement, but not yet paid, for the fiscal year budget in existence at the time of the breach.
- 9. Failure to declare a breach or the actual waiver of any particular breach of the Agreement or its material or nonmaterial terms by either Party shall not operate as a waiver by such Party of any of its rights or remedies as to any other breach.
- 10. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the Parties hereto shall be governed by, and construed according to, the laws of the State of Nevada. The Parties consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Nevada state district courts for enforcement of this Agreement.
- 11. The illegality or invalidity of any provision or portion of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Agreement, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such provision did not exist. The unenforceability of such provision shall not be held to render any other provision or provisions of this Agreement unenforceable.
- 12. Except as otherwise expressly provided within this Agreement, all or any property presently owned by either Party shall remain in such ownership upon termination of this Agreement, and there shall be no transfer of property between the Parties during the course of this Agreement.
- 13. It is specifically agreed between the Parties executing this Agreement that it is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of the Agreement to create in the public or any member thereof a third-party beneficiary status hereunder, or to authorize anyone not a party to this Agreement to maintain a suit for personal injuries or property damage pursuant to the terms or provisions of this Agreement.
- 14. Each Party agrees to keep and maintain under generally accepted accounting principles full, true, and complete records and documents pertaining to this Agreement and present, at any reasonable time, such information for inspection, examination, review, audit and copying at any office where such records and documentation is maintained. Such records and documentation shall be maintained for three (3) years after final payment is made.
- 15. The Parties are associated with each other only for the purposes and to the extent set forth in this Agreement. Each Party is and shall be a public agency separate and distinct from the other Party and shall have the right to supervise, manage, operate, control, and direct performance of the details incident to its duties under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or joint venture, to create relationships of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for one agency whatsoever with respect to the indebtedness, liabilities, and obligations of the other agency or any other Party.
- 16. In connection with the performance of work under this Agreement, the Parties agree not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation or age, including, without limitation, with regard to employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training,

including, without limitation, apprenticeship. The Parties further agree to insert this provision in all subcontracts hereunder, except subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

- 17. Neither Party shall assign, transfer or delegate any rights, obligations or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 18. The Parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that the Parties are authorized by law to engage in the cooperative action set forth herein.
- 19. Pursuant to NRS 239.010, information or documents may be open to public inspection and copying. The Parties will have the duty to disclose unless a particular record is confidential by law or a common law balancing of interests.
- 20. Each Party shall keep confidential all information, in whatever form, produced, prepared, observed, or received by that Party to the extent that such information is confidential by law or otherwise required to be kept confidential by this Agreement.
- 21. This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body of each Party.
- 22. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties and as such is intended as a complete and exclusive statement of the promises, representations, negotiations, discussions, and other agreements that may have been made in connection with the subject matter hereof. Unless an integrated attachment to this Agreement specifically displays a mutual intent to amend a particular part of this Agreement, general conflicts in language between any such attachment and this Agreement shall be construed consistent with the terms of this Agreement. Unless otherwise expressly authorized by the terms of this Agreement, no modification or amendment to this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties unless the same is in writing and signed by the respective Parties hereto and approved by the Attorney General or his or her designee.
